15 COMES NOW Petitioner, **Jimmy Doe**, as and for Dissolution of Marriage with minor
16 children and alleges as follows:

17 Your spouse has filed a *“Petition for Dissolution”* (Divorce) or *“Petition for Annulment”* or
18 *“Petition for Legal Separation”* with the court. This Order is made at the direction of the
19 Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Arizona in Maricopa County. This Order has the same
20 force and effect as any order signed by the judge. You and your spouse **must** obey this Order.
21 This Order may be enforced by any remedy available under the law, including an *“Order of*
22 *Contempt of Court.”* To help you understand this Order, we have provided this explanation. Read
23 the explanation and then read the statute itself. **If you have any questions, you should contact a**
24 **lawyer for help.**

25 **EXPLANATION: (What does this Order mean to you?)**

- 26 **1. ACTIONS FORBIDDEN BY THIS ORDER:** From the time the *“Petition for*
27 *Dissolution”* (Divorce) or *“Petition for Annulment”* or *“Petition for Legal Separation”* is
28 filed with the court, until the judge signs the Decree, or until further order of the court, both
29 the Petitioner and the Respondent **shall not** do any of the following things:
- 30 ✓ You may **not** hide earnings or community property from your spouse, **AND**
 - 31 ✓ You may **not** take out a loan on the community property, **AND**
 - 32 ✓ You may **not** sell the community property or give it away to someone, **UNLESS**
33 you have the written permission of your spouse or written permission from the
34 court. The law allows for situations in which you may need to transfer joint or
35 community property as part of the everyday running of a business, or if the sale of

community property is necessary to meet necessities of life, such as food, shelter, or clothing, or court fees and attorney fees associated with this action. If this applies to you, you should see a lawyer for help, **AND**

- ✓ Do **not** harass or bother your spouse or the children, **AND**
- ✓ Do **not** physically abuse or threaten your spouse or the children, **AND**
- ✓ Do **not** take the minor children, common to your marriage, out of the State of Arizona for any reasons, without a written agreement between you and your spouse or a Court Order, **before** you take the minor children out of the State.
- ✓ Do **not** remove, or cause to be removed, the other party or the minor children of the parties from any existing insurance coverage, including medical, hospital, dental, automobile and disability insurance. Both parties shall maintain all insurance coverage in full force and effect.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS: Arizona Law, A.R.S. 25-315(A) provides:

- 1(a). **RESTRICTIONS ON PROPERTY OF THE MARRIAGE:** That both parties are enjoined from transferring, encumbering, concealing, selling, or otherwise disposing of any of the joint, common or community property of the parties, **except** if related to the usual course of business, the necessities of life, or court fees and reasonable attorney fees associated with an action filed under this article, without the written consent of the parties or the permission of the court.
- 1(b). **REQUIREMENTS OF BEHAVIOR:** That both parties are enjoined from molesting, harassing, disturbing the peace, or committing an assault or battery on, the person of the other party or any natural or adopted child of the parties.
- 1(c). **RESTRICTIONS ABOUT YOUR MINOR CHILDREN:** That both parties are enjoined from removing any natural or adopted minor child(ren) of the parties, then residing in Arizona, from the jurisdiction of the court without the prior written consent of the parties or the permission of the court.
- 1(d). **RESTRICTIONS ABOUT INSURANCE:** That both parties are enjoined from removing, or causing to be removed, the other party or the minor children of the parties from any existing insurance coverage, including medical, hospital, dental, automobile and disability insurance. Both parties shall maintain all insurance coverage in full force and effect.
2. **EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDER:** This Order is effective against the person who filed for divorce, annulment, or legal separation (the Petitioner) when the Petition was filed with the court. It is effective against the other party (the Respondent) when it is served on the other party, or on actual notice of the Order, whichever is sooner. This Order shall remain in effect until further order of the court, or the entry of a Decree of Dissolution, Annulment, or Legal Separation.
3. **ORDER TO PETITIONER:** You **must** serve a copy of this Order upon the Respondent, along with a copy of the Petition for Dissolution, Annulment or Legal Separation, the Summons, and other required court papers.
4. **WARNING:** This is an official Court Order. If you disobey this Order, the court may find you in contempt of court. You may also be arrested and prosecuted for the crime of interfering with judicial proceedings and any other crime you may have committed by disobeying this Order.
5. **LAW ENFORCEMENT:** You or your spouse may file a certified copy of this Order with your local law enforcement agency. You may obtain a certified copy from the Clerk of the Court that issues this Order. If any changes are made to this Order and you have filed a certified copy of this Order with your local law enforcement agency, you **must** notify them

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of the changes.

13 **IMPORTANT INFORMATION IF YOU ARE ON YOUR SPOUSE'S INSURANCE PLAN:** When a Petition for
14 Dissolution of Marriage (papers for a divorce decree) is filed, you and/or your children may continue to be covered
15 under your spouse's health insurance policy. Arizona law allows the dependent spouse and/or children to continue to be
16 covered, but you must take some steps to protect your rights.

17 **WHAT INSURANCE COVERAGE APPLIES TO YOU, AND HOW TO GET IT:** If you are covered by your
18 spouse's health insurance, and you want to continue to be covered after the divorce is final, you **must** contact the
19 insurance company as soon as possible, and you **must** start to pay the monthly insurance premium within 31 days of
20 the date the insurance would otherwise stop.

21 If you decide you want to be covered, the insurer can choose whether to continue coverage under the current policy, or
22 to change the policy to your name. If the policy is changed to your name, it is called a "converted"; policy. If the policy
23 is converted by the insurer, the insurer must provide you the same or the most similar level of coverage available,
24 unless you ask for a lower level of coverage.

25 **WHAT COVERAGE APPLIES TO YOUR CHILDREN:** If you choose to continue coverage as a dependent
26 spouse, you can also choose to continue coverage for your dependent children if you are responsible for their care or
support.

PREEXISTING CONDITIONS OR EXCLUSIONS FROM INSURANCE COVERAGE: Whether the insurance
is continued or converted, the insurance must be provided to you without proof of insurability and without exclusions
for coverage other than what was previously excluded before the insurance was continued or converted.

LIMITS ON RIGHTS TO INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILDREN: You may **not** be
entitled to continued or converted coverage if you are eligible for Medicare or for coverage by other similar types of
insurance which together with the continued coverage would make you over-insured. However, dependent children of
a person who is eligible for Medicare may be covered by a continuance or a conversion. If you have questions about
coverage, check with the insurer and/or the spouse's employer.

WARNING TO THE SPOUSE FILING THE PETITION FOR DISSOLUTION (DIVORCE): This Notice must
be served on your spouse together with the Petition for Dissolution, the Summons, and the Preliminary
Injunction.

14 **ARIZONA LAW REQUIRES all actions for DIVORCE or LEGAL SEPARATION to**
15 **include this NOTICE and for the person filing for Divorce or Legal Separation to**
16 **SERVE this NOTICE on the other party. (ARS 25-318(F)).**

17 **YOU AND YOUR SPOUSE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR COMMUNITY DEBTS.** The court
18 usually requires/orders one spouse or the other to pay certain community debts in, or through, the Decree of Dissolution
19 or Legal Separation. A court order that does this is binding on the spouses **only, not the creditors.** You and your spouse
20 are legally responsible for these community debts whether you are married, divorced, or legally separated. These debts
21 are matters of contract between **both of you** and your creditors (such as banks, credit unions, credit card companies,
22 utility companies, medical providers and retailers). On request, the court may impose a lien against the separate property
23 of a spouse to secure payment of certain community debts.

24 **CONTACT CREDITORS:** You may want to contact your creditors to discuss the debts and the effects of your
25 divorce/legal separation on your debts. To assist you in identifying your creditors, you may obtain a copy of your spouse's
26 credit report by making a written request to the court for an order requiring a credit reporting agency to release the report
to you. The credit report will help you identify accounts, account numbers and account balances. In addition, within
thirty (30) days after receipt of a request from a spouse who is party to a divorce or legal separation, which includes the
court and cause number of the action, creditors are required, by law, to provide information as to the balance and account
status of any debts for which you or your spouse may be liable to the creditor.
